

Authors' Instructions for Preparation of Abstracts

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Introduction:

Your Abstract if accepted by the journal will be part of the indexed European Journal of Public Health, therefore we ask that authors follow the guidelines explained in this example in order to achieve a uniform compilation of all Abstracts. The presenting author must register and pay the registration fee of 1st International Congress on Health Literacy to ensure its work publication.

Objectives:

The structured abstract should summarize the contents of the original work and contain between 1000 and 2000 characters.

Methods:

Abstracts must be submitted in English, but may be presented at the congress either in English or in Portuguese. Authors should submit their abstract in English, carefully checked for correct grammar and spelling, addressing one or several of the congress' areas or topics. Unlisted but related sub-topics are also acceptable, provided they fit in one of the following topic areas: Health Promoting Institutions; Literacy in health and lifelong learning; Innovation and Technology on health literacy promotion; Health literacy, well-being and life quality; Challenges in health literacy; Health care and literacy.

Results:

The use of the 5 included main sections (Introduction, Objectives, Methods, Results and Conclusions) is mandatory. The author submitting the abstract must state (on the behalf of all authors) for the originality of the abstract and authorise the publication of the abstract at European Journal of public health at the "check box" in the submission form.

Conclusions:
